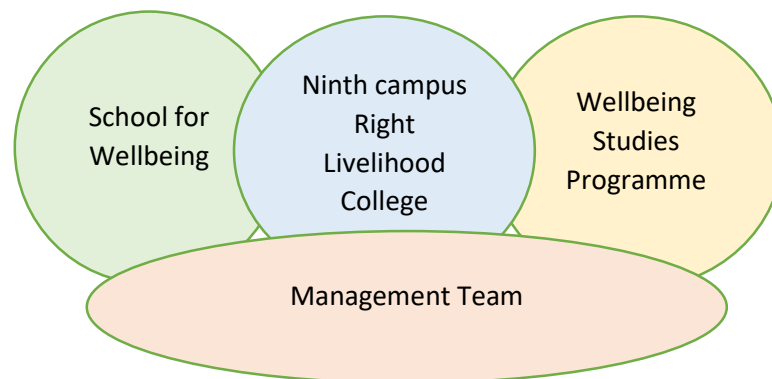
Background information

Organsational structure



The “**School for Wellbeing (...)**”, founded 20 August 2009, is governed by a partnership of Sathirakoses Nagapradipa Foundation (SNF), its legal body (Thailand), and the Centre for Bhutan Studies & GNH (Bhutan) (MOU 18 April 2017). A Management Team has been formed with Wongsanit Ashram (shared campus founded by Sulak Sivaraksa, 40 km outside Bangkok), Towards Organic Asia (TOA), both coordinated by Narumon Paiboonsittikun, and Innovation Network International (INI), an independent social enterprise founded by Hans and Wallapa. TOA is a

partnership of 24 organisations in the Mekong region + Bhutan. The School for Wellbeing organizes annual study visits to Bhutan and study visits of CBS & GNH teams to Thailand and the region. Wallapa van Willenswaard chairs the Management Team.

The “**Wellbeing Studies Programme**” is governed by an Executive Committee with Chulalongkorn University (CU), Royal University of Bhutan (RUB), Right Livelihood College (RLC) and Sathirakoses Nahgapradipa Foundation (SNF)(MOU 24 July 2015). Its major joint activity is the Chulalongkorn University Right Livelihood College Summerschool (CURLS). The Executive Committee has been formed with 2 representatives of each partner.

Narumon Paiboonsittikun is CURLS Coordinator; supported by CURLS alumni, students and graduates of CU, together with interns of Princeton University, US, as volunteers. Victor Karunan and Hans van Willenswaard provide management support where needed.

Excerpt from the MOU

INSTRUMENTS OF COOPERATION Article 7 (guidelines for the brainstorm):

7. School for Wellbeing will serve as the **Southeast-Asian Partner** of the Right Livelihood College and agrees to undertake the following:

7.1. Give access to the Right Livelihood Awardees to its **research and educational activities**, favoring the creation of relationships and the promotion of changes and innovations in the fields of environment, human rights and human development.

7.2. To host a minimum of one Right Livelihood Award Laureate a year for a **Right Livelihood Lecture**.

7.3 To co-host an Annual **Chulalongkorn University Right Livelihood Summer School (CURLS)** as described in the Memorandum of Understanding between CU, RUB, RLC and SNF (24 July 2015).

7.4. To foster **PhD and Masters' studies** and **Fellowships** among the students of the participating universities with the School for Wellbeing to undertake and promote research on the **issues developed by recipients of the Right Livelihood Award**.

7.5. School for Wellbeing and RLAF agree to communicate regularly, with a minimum of one teleconference every quarter. School for Wellbeing commits to devote **appropriate staff time** for the coordination of local activities including linking up with the Global Secretariat of the RLC initiative and other Campuses in the RLC network.

7.6. School for Wellbeing will publicize the RLC through its network and **website** on a regular basis.

7.7. The RLAF will involve and encourage the commitment of the Right Livelihood College and Awardees to **fully engage in this venture**.

7.8. Also, for the undertaking of specific projects under this understanding, School for Wellbeing and RLAF must **sign specific cooperation agreements** in which the rights and liabilities of the parties are detailed, especially economic commitments assumed by each.
